LECTURERS

Keynote speaker: Ronald Gaastra

He has been coaching clubs and Federation from 1982–2021, so lots of experience at national and international level. He coached at 7 Olympics in which the gold (Frederik Deburghgraeve 100 meter breaststroke men Atlanta 1996) and silver (Pieter Timmers 100 meter freestyle men Rio 2016) were the highlights. All together he and his swimmers got over 30 medals at the major international meets (EJC, EC 25 +50 meter, WC and OG).

Brian D. Marshall

Brian is currently the performance director (swimming) for Parasport Danmark and club manager for Svømmeklubben FREM-Odense. Brian is also leading the Mentor program for the Finnish Swimming Federation. Over the past 30 years, Brian has worked with elite swimmers and developed clubs in England, Iceland and Denmark.
